Football

Association football, more commonly known as football or soccer is a team sport played with a spherical ball between two teams of **eleven players**.

CRICKET

Cricket is a bat-and-ball game played between two teams of **eleven players** on a field at the centre of which is a 20-metre (22-yard) pitch with a wicket at each end, each comprising two bails balanced on three stumps.

The bat is made of wood, usually salix alba (white willow), and has the shape of a blade topped by a cylindrical handle. The blade must not be more than four and one quarter inches (108 mm) wide and the total length of the bat not more than 38 inches (965 mm). There is no standard for the weight which is usually between 2 lb 7 oz and 3 lb (1.1 and 1.4 kg).

The ball is a hard leather-seamed spheroid, with a circumference of 22.9 centimetres (9.0 in). The ball has a "seam": six rows of stitches attaching the leather shell of the ball to the string and cork interior.

The Trophies and Cups: ICC Cricket World Cup:

- The ICC Cricket World Cup is the international championship of One Day International (ODI) cricket. The event is organized by the sport's governing body, the International Cricket Council (ICC), every four years.
- The 2019 Cricket World Cup was the 12th Cricket World Cup, hosted by England and Wales.
- England defeated New Zealand to win their First ICC Cricket World Cup 2019.
- Ten teams participated in 2019 world cup.
- The 2023 Cricket World Cup is the 13th edition of the Cricket World Cup, scheduled to be hosted by India.
- The 2019 World Cup will feature 10 teams, a decrease from previous World Cups in 2011 and 2015 which featured 14 teams.

Ashes Trophy:

- The Ashes is a Test cricket series played between England and Australia.
- 2019 Ashes series recently played in England, Australia retained the Ashes after winning the fourth Test, with England levelling the series 2–2 in the final test, resulting in the first drawn Ashes series since 1972.
- The 2021-22 Ashes Series is an upcoming series of Test cricket matches to be played between England and Australia for The Ashes in Australia.

Asia Cup:

- The ACC Asia Cup is a men's One Day International and Twenty20 International cricket tournament.
- It was originally scheduled to be held every two years.
- The 2018 Asia Cup was a One-Day International (ODI) cricket tournament that was held in the United Arab Emirates in September 2018.
- Number of team participated in 2018 Asia cup was 6: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Hong Kong
- India was the defending champions and retained their title, after beating Bangladesh by three wickets in the final.
- The 2022 Asia cup scheduled to be hosted by SriLanka.

Ranji Trophy:

- The Ranji Trophy is a domestic first-class cricket championship played in India between teams representing regional and state cricket associations.
- The current Ranji Trophy champion is Saurashtra, which won against Bengal in the final match of the 2019–20 season held at Chandigarh.

- Emma Raducanu won the women's singles title. This was her first Grand Slam title.
- Rajeev Ram (USA) and Joe Sailsbury were the winner of men's doubles team in 2021.
- Samantha Stosur and Zhang Shuai were the winner of the women's doubles team in 2021.
- Desirae Krawczyk and Joe Sailsbury were the winner of Mixed Doubles team in 2021.

Davis Cup:

- The Davis Cup is the premier international team event in men's tennis. It is run by the International Tennis Federation (ITF) and is contested annually between teams from competing countries in a knock-out format. It is described by the organisers as the "World Cup of Tennis", and the winners are referred to as the World Champion team.
- The competition began in 1900 as a challenge between Great Britain and the United States. By 2016, 135 nations entered teams into the competition.
- The most successful countries over the history of the tournament are the United States (winning 32 tournaments and finishing as runners-up 29 times) and Australia (winning 28 times, including four occasions with New Zealand as Australasia, and finishing as runners-up 19 times).
- The present champions are Croatia, who beat France to win their second title in 2018.

FIELD HOCKEY

Field hockey is a team game of the hockey family. The earliest origins of the game date back to the Middle Ages in Pakistan. The game can be played on grass, water turf, artificial turf or synthetic field as well as an indoor board surface. Each team plays with **eleven players, including the goalie.**

Players use sticks made out of wood, carbon fibre, fibre glass or a combination of carbon fibre and fibre glass in different quantities to hit a round, hard, plastic ball. The length of the stick depends on the player's individual height.

Men's Hockey Trophies and Cups: -

- The ASHF Asia Cup: The ASHF Asia Cup is an international men's and women's field hockey tournament governed by the Asian Hockey Federation (ASHF). It was introduced in 1982 for men's competition and the women's competition was added a year later as non-official championship until the official tournament held in 1985. South Korea has been the most successful team with 4 titles in Men's and 3 titles in Women's competition. India has reached the most number of finals in Men's (8 times) and South Korea, Japan(tied) in Women's (5 times) competitions.
- Hockey World Cup: -
 - ➤ The Men's Hockey World Cup is an international field hockey competition organized by the International Hockey Federation (FIH). The tournament was started in 1971. It is held every four years, bridging the four years between the Summer Olympics.
 - ➤ There is also a Women's Hockey World Cup, which has been held since 1974 and was organised by the International Federation of Women's Hockey Associations (IFWHA) until 1981, when the governing bodies merged into the current International Hockey Federation in 1982.

- Pakistan is the most successful team, having won the tournament four times. The Netherlands and Australia have each won three titles, and Germany has won two titles. Belgium and India have both won the tournament once.
- ➤ The 2018 tournament was held in Bhubaneswar, India from 28 November to 16 December. Belgium defeated Netherlands in a penalty shoot-out 3–2 after the match ended in a 0–0 tie to win their first World Cup title. The World Cup expanded to 16 teams in 2018, and FIH will evaluate the possibility of increasing it to 24 in 2022.
- The 2023 Hockey World Cup will be held at the Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneswar.

Polo is a horseback mounted team sport. It is one of the world's oldest known team sports.

A game of Central Asian origin, polo was first played in Persia (Iran) at dates given from the 6th century BC to the 1st century AD.

The game is played by two opposing teams with the objective of scoring goals by hitting a small hard ball with a long-handled wooden mallet, and through the opposing team's goal. Each team has **four mounted riders**, and the game usually lasts one to two hours, divided into periods called chukkas (or "chukkers").

WEIGHT LIFTING

Olympic-style weightlifting, or Olympic weightlifting, often simply referred to as weightlifting, is an athletic discipline in the modern Olympic programme in which the athlete attempts a maximum-weight single lift of a barbell loaded with weight plates.

The two competition lifts in order are the snatch and the clean and jerk. The snatch is a wide-grip, one-move lift. The clean and jerk is a close-grip, two-move lift.

Each weightlifter receives three attempts in each, and the combined total of the highest two successful lifts determines the overall result within a bodyweight category. Bodyweight categories are different for male and female competitors.

GYMNASTIC

Gymnastics is a sport that includes exercises requiring balance, strength, flexibility, agility, coordination and endurance. The movements involved in gymnastics contribute to the development of the arms, legs, shoulders, back, chest and abdominal muscle groups. CHESS

Chess is a **two-player** strategy board game played on a chessboard, a checkered game-board with 64 squares arranged in an eight-by-eight grid.

Each player begins the game with 16 pieces: one king, one queen, two rooks, two knights, two bishops, and eight pawns. Each of the six-piece types moves differently. The most powerful piece is the queen and the least powerful piece is the pawn. The objective is to 'checkmate' the opponent's king by placing it under an inescapable threat of capture. To this end, a player's pieces are used to attack and capture the opponent's pieces, while supporting their own.

In addition to checkmate, the game can be won by voluntary resignation by the opponent, which typically occurs when too much material is lost, or if checkmate appears unavoidable. A game may also result in a draw in several ways.

SNOOKER

Snooker is a cue sport played on a table covered with a green cloth or baize, with pockets at each of the four corners and in the middle of each of the long side cushions. A full-size table measures 11 ft 81/2 in \times 5 ft 10 in (3569 mm x 1778 mm), commonly referred to as 12×6 ft.

Using a cue and 22 coloured balls, players must strike the white ball (or "cue ball") to pot the remaining balls in the correct sequence, accumulating points for each pot.

By 1960, international playing rules had been standardized for the game, and the International Federation of Netball and Women's Basketball (later renamed the International Netball Federation (INF)) was formed. As of 2011, the INF comprises more than 60 national teams organized into five global regions.
